

Welcome to the Holmboe Conifer Forest State Natural Area

A gift for all time from Frithjof Holmboe and Thoralf Holmboe, this unique, 32-acre site was one of the first areas donated for conservation to The Nature Conservancy of Wisconsin in 1967. The property was transferred to the Northwoods Land Trust in 2007 as a local conservation partner.

The trails wind through mature, climax forest habitats featuring hemlock, giant red pines and white pines, white cedar and black spruce swamp and along the scenic Pelican River.

The property was dedicated as a State Natural Area in 1969. Canada yew and other rare species are found on this site.

Enjoy peace and solitude on your walk through this beautiful, old-growth forest.

Preserve Rules

While you are in the State Natural Area, the following are prohibited:

- *Picking flowers, berries, nuts, mushrooms, rocks, shells, plants or other parts of the natural landscape.
- *Pets, even on a leash (except seeing eye dogs).
- *Bicycles or other wheeled or motorized vehicles.
- *Camping or picnic fires.
- *Hunting, trapping or fishing except by express permission of the Northwoods Land Trust.



Directions: From the Intersection of Hwy. 17 South and Hwy. 8/45 on the south side of Rhinelander, go north on Boyce Dr. (Bus. 17) about one-half mile. Parking access is in the lot behind the Taylor Park nursing home facility on the east side of Boyce Dr., just south of the Pelican River bridge.
